## Thoughts from BCANY Executive Director, Dave Archer

The basketball world at the Professional, Collegiate, Scholastic and Youth levels in the nation continues to change in large and small ways. The number and magnitude of these changes makes it ever more difficult to be a high school coach.

At the scholastic level of basketball across the nation it did not take long for Name – Image and Likeness to become part of the culture. Transferring has become common place as well. It seems like there are a number of transfers from other states to New York State and from schools in our State to other schools in our State.

Travel basketball has become a major influencer at the youth level. Money has taken over the game at every level. So very many of you went into coaching to teach and coach a team of individuals and develop them into a cohesive team. You went into coaching to teach values and character and help people to grow mentally and physically. As you know, the National High School Basketball Coaches Association, Inc. has developed and is implementing an *Educate to Navigate* initiative to unite education based coaches throughout the nation to make positive changes in the game and culture.

## The Rise of Unorthodox Defenses

This high school season has been a long and cold one. Coaching for 27 years on Long Island I have never seen high school teams use unorthodox defenses like the box and one, triangle and two and diamond and one so frequently. Typical man to man packline and regular zones like a 2-3 or a 1-2-2 are still common ,but this year I have gone to at least 20 games that have included an unorthodox defensive strategy. The question is why.

I don't know the answer. But I think it's important as a coach to examine possible reasons. One possibility is that we are now dealing with kids whose youth basketball was interrupted by Covid-19 and has reduced the skill base that usually exists. This also caused many players to never take up the game in the first place. The result is a pool of players where teams have to use much weaker players in their lineup. Each team has really good players who trained and played AAU but the skill gap can be large between your best player and your fourth and fifth starters so therefore we see more unorthodox defenses. That is theory number one.

Another possible theory is the availability of information. Almost every team has Hudl here on Long Island and also access to *Hudl Fan* for scouting. If you don't have these tools I would investigate getting them. Hudl allows people to keep film and exchange film easily as well as see the in-depth stats of both teams from a particular game. I believe sometimes when you are coaching you do not realize how some kids on the court struggle. When you look at the in- depth stats it could give support to the idea that these defenses can help you win.

Also *Hudl Fan* allows people to scout easier. This leads coaches who normally would not scout to be able to and then to conclude that these types of defenses are their best opportunity to win. Finally, access to tutorials of these defenses on Youtube allow them to be easily implemented. You realize with one search that not only are there very few offensive strategies to combat these defenses available to the average coach but the information to install them is readily available. The success that these coaches have with these defenses will determine if coaches around the state will have to adjust to a reality where this may become commonplace. Whatever your theory, the impacts in reality on the court will impact every coach in the state at some point.
